

MCSA Meeting
May 15, 2018

Correspondence:

The new steel targets on the pistol range **ARE NOT** for magnum rounds. People who use the new equipment please take care of it so that we may bring more upgrades to the club.

Due to recent damage to the lights in the indoor range new security cameras have been installed at the clubhouse both outside and inside.

Richard Arnold requested that the Range Rule #7 be emphasized to members since he recently saw Rule #7 being violated on the rifle range. (Guns are to be unloaded and chambers open when people are downrange)

A proposal for a sign for the Jackson ranch on the range was tabled, as Mike Vennard was not present.
